#### What's Under Your Needle?

So, while the rest of the world has come to a standstill, what have our members been up to? Some attended the recent retreat, albeit not face-to-face. Others were busy tackling the million-mask challenge. Here's a sampling of how people have been spending their time at home:



### On Mask Making:

You don't have to use any particular pattern to participate in the mask-making effort; My New Red Shoes will sort the masks and distribute them to hospitals, et al., to match their requirements. Your masks can have nose wires or not, elastic, ribbon ties, slots for filters or not, interfacing or not. Some of their contacts have specific requirements (at this point anyway) and some places like Highland Hospital in Oakland said "We would love 600 masks of any kind." Becca, the director of community engagement at My New Red Shoes, has been told that some healthcare people are using the homemade masks over the surgical/n95 masks to make them last longer. Make whatever you are comfortable with. Ideas for substitutions for elastic and nose strips (this is OPTIONAL)

- · For elastic: cutting elastic out of old clothes you don't need; elastic pony tail bands; Julie Curry suggested "For straps, use two 40" x 1 1/2" strips of fabric. Then center & attach to top and bottom of mask like binding.
- · For metal nose pieces: twist ties, paper clips, corsage flower wire, bridal sewing wire, pieces of firm plastic that bend but hold their shape, underwire from old bras. These can/should be covered with fabric and hot glued in with pointy ends well protected.
- · Jenny Doan at Missouri Star Quilts has an easy tutorial.

## Why make masks:

Here is what the CDC says about health care workers using home-made masks:

In settings where face masks are not available, HCP might use homemade masks (e.g., bandana, scarf) for care of patients with COVID-19 as a last resort. However, homemade masks are not considered PPE, since their capability to protect HCP is unknown. Caution should be exercised when considering this option. Homemade masks should ideally be used in combination with a face shield that covers the entire front (that extends to the chin or below) and sides of the face.

- · Always Quilting is taking drop-offs also

The Mills-Peninsula folks are going to pick up at Always Quilting, and we could also do pick up here for My New Red Shoes - people would just have to specify which group they are donating to. We would do a no-contact drop-off by appointment only. We ask people to call before coming, and we will have a donation box by the door. Then they just need to drop their donations in the box. We will watch from the lobby to make sure their donation is safely inside.

# **Peninsula Quilters Board Meeting**

March 18, 2020

Held remotely via Zoom

Attendees: Jena Walter, Angi Merlone, Leslie Lohmeier, Linda McAllister, Jess Millikan, Michele Parry, Judy Miyake, Ruth Gilroy, Gale Green, Connie Bowles, Sue Garcia, Wanda Dragon Meeting called to order at 12:15 by Jena Walter. Minutes from the previous board meeting approved as published. Motion to approve by Angi, seconded by Gale.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Activities** (Judy Miyake): Status of county fair currently unknown; PQ Challenge to be discussed under new business

**Fundraising (Gale Green):** May not have fair this year or other opportunities to display Opportunity Quilt. Further, there will be no revenue from raffle baskets for the foreseeable future. While income will be down, expenses not expected to go up. Leslie pointed out that we have a budget deficit for this year, Alice's Love allowance will not be spent this year.

**Membership** (Ruth Gilmore): Local cancellations and shutdowns have had no impact on membership so far.

**Newsletter:** No report. The newsletter may become the main way of connecting with members. We will be doing more blasts.

Programs, Outreach, Web: No report

#### **New Business:**

Meetings and activities: Meeting spaces are closed county wide until further notice. Terry is rescheduling speakers and workshops; Dora Cary workshop rescheduled for Nov. 9-10.

New Member tea cancelled: cannot reschedule without more information from county health authorities Quilter of the Year: about to vote, will do so either by email or by regular mail to Angi. QOTY will be awarded at first meeting after we return.

Keeping members engaged: suggestion that we film a tutorial on something to send members, such as a YouTube video or Zoom session. Julie Curry showing or demonstrating one of the Scrappy Bee charity quilts was suggested. No definite decision.

Kathy McGuffin joined meeting. Suggested monthly board meetings.

Studio Tour Progress (Connie Bowles): Planning proceeding with target date of Sept. 12 with publicity kick-off in May. Nine hosts have signed up to open their studios, will need support staff during the day. Hosts may provide light snacks but will not be serving wine. Publicity planned on-line via Facebook, notification to local guilds. Will also print yard signs, postcards and maps. Tickets will be \$25 per visitor for the day. Payment will be accepted through links on the PQ website, Facebook page, newsletter site. Affiliates will be approached to contribute towards a grand prize for attendees. Attendees will receive a fat quarter at each studio they visit: We will solicit these from PQ members (will need 205-500). PQ Challenge: Can we hold this as a video show and tell? No conclusion. We can postpone the date to the first physical meeting after the guild returns to the Garden Center. We can still display the quilts as a group at the fair as long as there are at least six of them. Jess will purchase the prizes -- gift certificates for Always Quilting -- to award whenever we meet. Meeting adjourned at 1:15.

Through July 19, Rosie Lee Tompkins: A Retrospective at the UC Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive.
