#### March 19, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 9:31 by President Jess Millikan, who welcomed members, 1 guest, and representatives from the Diablo Valley Quilters. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer Leslie Lohmeier reported balances of \$37,401 in our checking account and \$19,328 in Vanguard. As anticipated, we are starting to spend into our bank account, but still have a large reserve.

**Corresponding secretary's report:** If anyone knows of someone who should receive a card, let Joanne Damiano know. We received thanks from the Lucille Packard Hospital for 76 quilts, from the Stitchers of St. Anthony for a donation from Anne Merics, and from the San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles for donation of \$400 in memory of late PQ members.

PQ continues to receive inquiries on donating fabrics, etc. If anyone knows of places that accept donations of fabric and similar items let Jess know so she can respond.

#### **Announcements:**

- Lynelle Bilsey from Life Moves talked about Life Moves, their shelters, and other programs.
- Judy Miyake and Linda Hester: May Bee Charitable canceled due to conflict with workshop. Next event will likely be in conjunction with another pop-up quilt show in October.
- Sandy Kelly: The supply list for the April workshop is available on-line at the PQ website. To get an idea of what the April workshop will be, see Sandy Bruce's website for examples of her work.
- Sandy Kelly: The August meeting will be an auction. If you are interested in donating items for the auction, please give Sandy a written description.

New this year: quilting day at the fair - bring your machines, quilt kits will be provided.

#### PENINSULA QUILTERS GUILD BOARD MEETING MINUTES

#### San Mateo Garden Center, March 19, 2019

The meeting was called to order by president Jess Millikan. Present: Jess Millikan, Leslie Lohmeier, Jo Ann Damiano, Judy Miyake, Ruth Gilroy, Jena Walter, Linda McAllister, Marry Raftery, Judy Brumm, Kathy McGuffin

• Correction to minutes of last meeting: the 1st chair report was given by Judy Brumm. The minutes were otherwise approved.

#### Chair reports

- Activities/Educational Events (Judy Miyake): The annual challenge is due at the next meeting.
- Fundraising (Jess Millikan for Nanette Campeau):
  - ✓ Connie Bowles and Sarah Guyol will chair the Studio Tour committee. They will present an update at the next meeting.
  - ✓ The proposed Quiltathon still needs a chair; Jess will followup with Nanette. Barbara Hall will investigate whether we can hold it at the Holiday Inn we use for retreats.
  - ✓ Our Opportunity Quilt will be at the San Francisco Guild meeting in June. Jess will ask Gill to check with our affiliate member shops about displaying our quilt and selling tickets.
  - ✓ There is as yet no 2020 opportunity quilt
- Membership (**Ruth Gilroy**): No new members recently. Discussion: shall we try to engage new members more? It was suggested that we ask new members and visitors whether they want to introduce themselves at meetings rather than putting them on the spot.
- Programs (Terry Caselton for Teresa Rosensweig):

- ✓ Terry has started booking speakers for the 2019-2020 year and inquired whether we should have speakers at every meeting. After discussion, concluded that most meetings should have outside speakers, but they could include affiliates, vendors, members, etc.
- ✓ Trip to Road to California: Terry will come up with some survey questions for a SurveyMonkey/PQ blast so we can determine if there is sufficient interest to organize a Guild sponsored trip.
- Outreach (Judy Brumm): nothing to report

#### **New Business:**

- Determining a quorum: some positions have 2 members sharing the duties, and some members have more than one voting position. After discussion, determined that a member carries only one vote, regardless of how many positions she holds; and, each position carries only one vote, regardless of how many people share the role. On that basis, a quorum this year is 7 people.
- Proxy Voting: Per Roberts' Rules of Order, proxy voting is not allowed.
- By-laws updates: Our standing rules provide for a review of the By-Laws every three years, to be conducted by a committee consisting of the Parliamentarian (chair), a past president, and 3 members of the Guild. When that review happens, topics that should be evaluated include:
  - ✓ whether to permit proxy votes at board meetings.
  - ✓ workshop refunds
  - ✓ dues
  - ✓ Honorary Life Members: should we eliminate requirement for membership ratification
- Honorary Life Members: Reviewed procedure for nominations (any active member may present a written recommendation to the Board; Board reviews and presents "selected" candidates to the membership for ratification). Discussion (without decision) whether to limit the length of time deceased Honorary Life Members are included in the Roster.

As some of you know, I have moved out of the Bay Area. I will be spending winters in Palm Desert and summers in Oceanside. I was happy to go on the Alice Lam field trip to Folsom this month and see many of you. My "entrance quilt" was a twin-sized top, which was never shown at a meeting. I made the top by putting together several squares that I had made while taking a Craftsy Sampler class. My original calculations called for 28 blocks. However, time got away from me and I decided that 24 blocks with borders would work. As usual, there were many challenges such as duplicating a square but finding that all the pieces had opposite orientations. A task that should have been easy took several days to unravel. I had several small unused pieces that I was able to use to construct a new block. One time saver was to use attractive fabric as a square. If you look at the photo, you will see several squares of uncut fabric. I gradually moved away from the Craftsy blocks and started designing my own. That was fun. I chose compatible fabrics and created blocks to highlight them. I want to take this opportunity to thank the members of the guild for the camaraderie and support over the time that I was a member. I cannot believe how much I learned from the Peninsula Quilters Guild.

Jan 20 – April 14 International Techstyle Art Biennial IV - In 2010, the San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles launched its signature event, the *International TECHstyle Art Biennial (ITAB)*. Returning now for its fourth incarnation, *ITAB* is a juried exhibition of work by artists merging fiber media with new information and communication technologies in their artistic processes, as a medium of artistic expression, and/or in the content of their work. Leveraging its location in Silicon Valley, *ITAB* serves as the premiere platform for introducing the work of artists exploring the intersection of fiber and technology to a global community.

**Jan 20 – April 14 Evanescence: Judith Content -** Palo Alto based artist, Judith Content, explores the essence of image, memory or a moment in time through the process of hand dying and stitched silk. Through discharge dyeing and shibori dyeing techniques, Content's work references the natural landscape with painterly movement and depth.

June 5 – July 14 Stone Portraits and Sacred Stonescapes: Denise Labadie - Labadie makes contemporary art quilt portraits of Celtic megalithic stones and monoliths, and more recent monastic ruins. These stonescapes – stone circles, standing stones, dolmens, burial tombs, abandoned churches, forgotten cemeteries, and lost-in-history portals and passageways – are both timeless and evoke deep remembrances of human pasts largely forgotten. Labadie's quilts are known both for their surprising emotionality, large size and, from a construction standpoint, their hand-painted fabrics, textures, color gradation, shadowing and perspective, depth of field, craftsmanship and technique precision.
