Michele Parry will do the assembly and the quilting for us. Thank you, Michele!

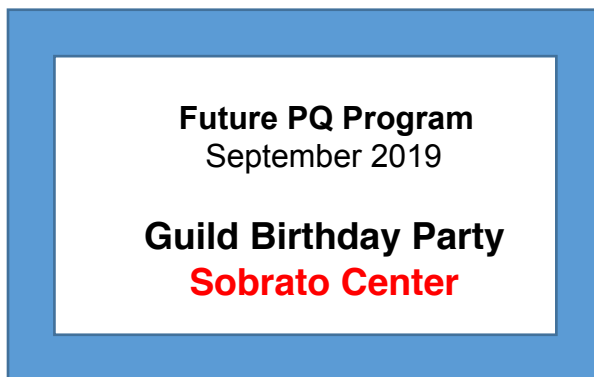

Shhhh, It's Time to Make Madam President's New Quilt

It is that time again and I am requesting your participation in preparing the President's quilt. The following directions will make the foundation element for two blocks in the finished quilt.

We will be making a 10-inch square strip-pieced block using bright and primary colors. Madam President is partial to greens so it would be great if you can include a green strip or two in the mix of your block.

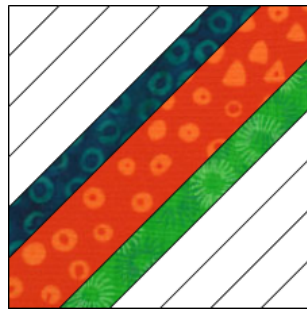
You will need:

A foundation square of muslin or light-colored quilt cotton that measures 10"x10".

One 3" wide x 15" long strip for center diagonal

Eight 1 ½" strips of various lengths

Two 2 ½" x 4" rectangles for corners

The wide strip should be placed centered across the diagonal. The block will be cut along the diagonal for assembly later so center the strip as best you can, but it does not have to be exact.

Using ¼" seams add successive strips on either side of the center diagonal working your way out to each corner. Finish the corners with the rectangles and trim the final block to 10-inches square. Pressing as you go will give a crisp finish to the block.

Please write your name in pencil or ink on the **back** of the block.

Blocks are due to Michèle Parry by September 18, 2019.

Most of you are probably very aware that PIQF will be October 17-20 at the Santa Clara Convention Center. As in past years, we will display our Opportunity Quilt and sell raffle tickets throughout the show. The "price of admission" for that privilege is that we must provide 32 hours of white glove volunteer work. We don't yet know which day(s) we will be assigned to white glove, but please start clearing your calendars to support the Guild by doing white glove duty and/or by selling Opportunity Quilt Tickets. We'll have sign-ups on [iVolunteer](#), and there will be more information available at the July and August meetings.

Alice's Love Event 2020

This event is sponsored by the WannaBee Bee through a generous donation from Harry (Alice's husband) and Andrew (Alice's son) Lam to honor our wonderful friend and 'bee sister', Alice Lam, who passed away in 2016. She loved for us to spend time together, enjoy good food, and generously give to others. This event reflects her giving spirit.

The 2019 Alice's Love event resulted in so many twin-size quilt tops, that the Bee Charitable Day coordinators (Judy Miyake and Linda Hester) were a bit overwhelmed with the tops that needed quilting. For the 2020 Alice's Love Event we would like to have completed quilts. So, the 'price' for the Event has been modified as follows: (on the signup sheet you will have to choose one of these options)

- **2 completed (pieced, quilted, bound) neonatal quilts** OR
- **1 completed (pieced, quilted, bound) twin size or larger quilt** OR
- **1 pieced twin size or larger quilt top WITH enough extra fabric for binding** OR
- For those who like to quilt -- **2 twin size or larger quilts quilted** (if you choose this option the WannaBees will ensure you get the quilt tops to quilt or you can coordinate with a friend who is

making a pieced twin top). This option might be attractive to those who have access to a long arm machine. OR

- For those who like to do hand binding -- **make and stitch binding on 1 quilted twin size quilt.** We prefer that the binding is machine sewn on the front and then hand stitched onto the back. If you choose this option, the WannaBees will ensure you get the quilted quilt to put the binding on or you can coordinate with a friend or friends that are doing option 3 or 4.

Old Business:

- **Opportunity Quilt:** Speaker Dora Carey is allowing us to use her pattern String of Beads. Jena Walter and Mary Rafferty volunteered to help Jess make "Beads." Michele Parry will provide the background fabric and do the quilting.
- **Road to California.** Terry reported that 10 rooms for Road to California have already been booked.

New Business:

- Inventory: Our Bylaws provide that the Recording Secretary is to maintain an inventory of all Guild property. Board members and committee chairs are asked to send a list of any property they have belonging to the Guild before the September board meeting.
- Binder updates: Jena has a form on google docs that will let people update their positions online and anyone who has not yet done so is asked to complete the form as soon as possible. She will compile a master binder with all job descriptions.

Jul 21 – Oct 13 Mayan Traje: A Tradition in The Maya of Guatemala are known worldwide for their excellent weaving and distinctive *trajes* (traditional clothing). These were once 100% village-specific, and people could be recognized as being from a specific place. Over time, many and diverse influences have caused significant change -- but even so, visitors are struck by the ubiquitous nature of indigenous weaving and the persistence of their “wearable art”. This exhibit will show outstanding examples of clothing from the early 20th century to contemporary fashion, highlight key differences, and explore some of the reasons for these changes. On view will be individual pieces as well as full *trajes* – none created for tourist markets. These will be drawn from the rarely-displayed collection of the Friends of the Ixchel Museum. www.ixchelfriends.org

Jul 21 – Oct 13 La Vie de Boheme – *La Vie de Bohème* celebrates the collaboration between two San Jose cultural institutions, San Jose Museum of Quilts & Textiles and Opera San José. Showcasing costumes, illustrations and props from Opera San José's production of *La Bohème*, the costumes illuminate the story of a group of bohemians, and how their lives become intertwined. Jul 21 – Aug 25 The Privilege to Breathe: Adia Millett *The Privilege to Breathe* is a series of abstracted textile pieces based on a few questions Adia began to ask herself, *Can privileges be universal? What are the privileges that inform who we are? And what is our role in creating change?* Initially the work that sprang from this inquiry developed into symbols for reconstructing her own relationship to economic disparity, white fragility, and male privilege. Using a combination of recycled and discarded fabrics, Millett pieces together images of hope. Through this process of investigation, she discovered something we all have... the privilege to breathe.
